The Madison Jewish community has had the pleasure to welcome strangers into our community and hearts over the last eight months. JSS, as an affiliate of HIAS, has settled 30 refugees from Syria, The Democratic Republic of Congo, Iraq and Afghanistan.

Now we must advocate so we can welcome more refugees!

At a time of global refugee crisis, with more displaced persons than at any time since World War II, it is critical for your elected officials to show continued support for protecting and welcoming refugees.

In the coming weeks, our government will determine the maximum number of refugees allowed to come to this country in the next year, and we need your help to make sure this number is at least 75,000. **Act now and tell you representatives to support a presidential determination of at least 75,000 Refugees.**

- *Jewish values call us to protect the human rights and dignity of every person, and I believe that in this moment when the number of refugees is at the highest point in human history, the U.S. government must do more—not less—to support refugees.*
